Pictures of welldressed and fashionable people gave him joy and inspiration, and that eventually led to him working on his own designs. Now he too hopes to inspire others with a fashion chain stocked with his original products.

Armed with the creative juices, but lacking the knowhow, Jia Jun decided to take a course that would teach him the ins and outs of running a business. When asked why he didn't just go for a pure business or fashion course, Jia Jun candidly replied that he liked cars as well. But before Jia Jun ventures into fashionpreneurship, or possibly even technopreneurship, he has his mind set on university after NS, and he hopes to do so via his own means.

"The community scholarship encouraged me to work harder, and hopefully paves the way to getting more scholarships, so I can continue to further my studies while paying for them by myself," he said.

A regular visitor to the CC for the sports facilities, Jia Jun read about the scholarship on the CC noticeboard and decided to give it a shot. Educational materials are expensive, and computers are mandatory. His mother is the sole breadwinner of the family since his father passed away three years ago, and he also has an older sister in university. With the scholarship money, he was able to purchase his own computer for his school work, and also use it to fulfil his muses in his free time.

Paying it forward, Jia Jun has started giving IT and mobile app literacy lessons to the elderly at the CC. Together with his friend, they spend about four days preparing power point slides for their lesson, which is delivered in English and Chinese. He takes enjoyment from watching his elderly students pick up the necessary skills so quickly, and he is already looking forward to the next one.

From a young age, Mitashah knew that she wanted to be a nurse. Her grandmother came down with a stroke, and she saw how difficult it had been on the patient. It was also a heavy responsibility on her caregivers who has to tend to her after she was discharged. Mitashah's cousin, a staff nurse, was the only one who possessed the necessary skills to take adequate care of their grandmother.

"I saw how the nurses were able to make my grandmother happy with their professionalism and good service, and I wanted to be like them. I want to be part of the team that journeys with families in their darkest times, and to help patients on their road to recovery."

Choosing a nursing course came naturally to her, and through her internships, she has received exposure to working in the highpressure hospital setting in the medical wards and surgical wards of two hospitals. She found it to be a stressful but good experience for her to understand where she stands at and how she can improve. If anything, it has hardened her resolve to be a nurse, and she already has her eyes set on the Diploma in Nursing course in Nanyang Polytechnic.

Aware that school fees and costs of educational materials will only go up with further education, and that she cannot always rely on her ageing parents, she applied for the community scholarship. She hopes that through tapping on scholarships, she will eventually be able to save enough money to go to universitý.

Thus far, she has put her interests in serving the community and her people skills to good use. She has sat in at a few Meet-the-People sessions, where she is looking forward to officially volunteer at. She has even helped the CC to plan Holi, an ancient Hindu festival.

Mitashah grew up in Bishan-Toa Payoh with fond memories of the playgrounds and family walks in the parks. School keeps her busy now, but on days when she gets to go home early, she still hits the parks with her parents

John knew early on that his ambition lay in the culinary arts. He remembers watching "a tonne of cooking programmes" on the television, during his growing up years. His mother, a homemaker, would prepare all their meals on a budget, showing him that one can elevate simple ingredients to great dishes. In secondary school, he took elective modules, including one in cooking, and that made him realise that he could turn his love for cooking

John then decided to enrol into Food Business Management to gain a wider understanding of his craft. The course also explores business elements, service elements, history and culture studies of different regions. He believes it is this knowledge that sets apart a chef from a cook. Since joining the course, he has also learned something about himself – his love for the adrenaline rush during the busy hours in the kitchen. This was something he had handson experience with during his internships, as well as part time jobs he took up with catering companies.

He has also developed an interest in competitions as it places significance on creativity and the fundamentals. "Working under pressure with strict times, trying to prepare a dish to the best of your ability is like nothing you can imagine," he explained.

Despite knowing clearly that he wants a career in cooking, John does not believe in planning too far ahead. For now, what is most important to him is to find a good mentor to continue learning from.

John applied for the community scholarship after reading about it from a poster in the lift. "It encouraged me to know that in our community, despite whatever issue you may face, your education need not be placed on the backburner. There will always be opportunities for assistance with the only requirement being that you put in your hundred percent," he said.

Despite his hectic schedule, John volunteers with the People's Association Youth Movement, where he has brought members of a local volunteer welfare organisation on excursions, and helped out with the Bursary Awards.
