Dear Residents,

2020 has been an extraordinary year for most of us and as we braved the COVID-19 pandemic together and emerged as a stronger community, our efforts in building and maintaining a well-balanced, holistic and improved standard of living for all continue.

A recap on some of the notable improvements for the year include the Lift Renewal Programme (LRP) to bring better accessibility to our residents, especially the elderly, the wheelchair-bound and families with young kids in strollers. The ban on personal mobility devices at HDB block void decks and common property was executed for the safety of the residents. And to combat the outbreak of COVID-19 last year, stepped-up efforts in cleanliness and safety management measures were also implemented in all areas to ensure a safe estate for all.

This year, residents can look forward to more community spaces projects for active living such as the mega playpark @Toa Payoh, more barrier free access ramps, covered linkways, sheltered drop-off points, lifts, playgrounds, fitness facilities and R&R to 160 blocks in our constituency.

Apart from maintaining the clean and green surroundings in the estate, more horticulture and greenery will be added to enhance the green spaces in the neighbourhood. In the pipeline are urban farming at some of the multi-storey carpark roof

gardens, roof solar panels, cool paint and smart LED lighting will be added to selected HDB blocks to achieve energy savings and sustainability in the long run.

As the nation moves into the digitalisation age, the Town Council had also taken a huge step in upgrading our digital platforms, to improve our service delivery and enhance communication with residents. The revamped official website offers a one-stop-shop of township information, community news and feedback mechanisms.

For the past year, we have all been adapting to the new norm of life and I will like to take this opportunity to extend my heartfelt appreciation to all residents, frontline conservancy workers and community partners who have worked together to maintain a clean and safe estate. And also my heartfelt thanks to the Bishan-Toa Payoh Town Council team of dedicated staff for their tireless efforts on the ground.

On behalf of my fellow MPs and Town Councillors, I would like to express my gratitude for your continued support and understanding. Having overcome many challenges in the past as one community, the Town Council will continue to safeguard the best interest of our residents and work closely with the community in reshaping our heartlands.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES AWARDS 2020

The annual Municipal Services Awards (MSA) recognise excellence in co-ordinating and delivering citizen-centric municipal services, and inter-agency efforts to provide effective solutions. Out of 105 nominations during the nomination period of 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 last year, Bishan-Toa Payoh Town Council's nominations were amongst the 17 recipients for the Team, Community and Individual categories.

Tier 3 Award, Community Category Combat COVID-19 As One Community Toa Payoh East-Novena

Winning the Tier 3 Award (highest tier) in the Community category is the team from Toa Payoh East-Novena. In recognising community partners who had contributed towards improving our living environment together with Partner Agencies and Town Councils, the Tier 3 Award was conferred to the Town Council, People's Association and Kumudra Myanmar Arts & Culture Association. This meaningful project included several ground-up initiatives like the "Public Spaces Wipe Down", "#toSGwithLove" and "Clean Hands, Good Health #SingaporeTogether". Receiving the Awards and certificates with the Toa Payoh East-Novena team was Mr Saktiandi Supaat, Adviser to Bishan-Toa Payoh GRC Grassroots Organisations and Vice Chairman of Bishan-Toa Payoh Town Council.

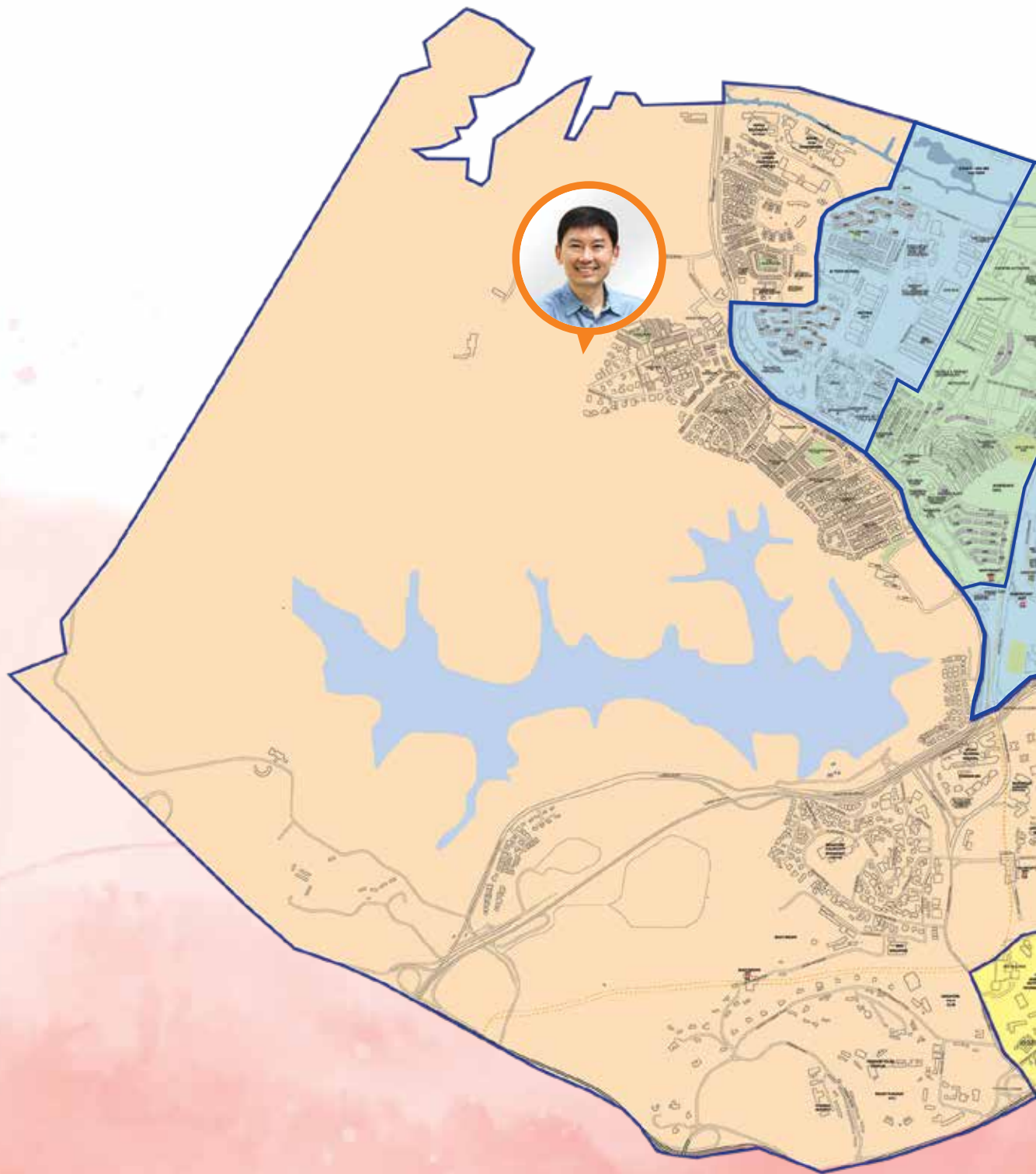

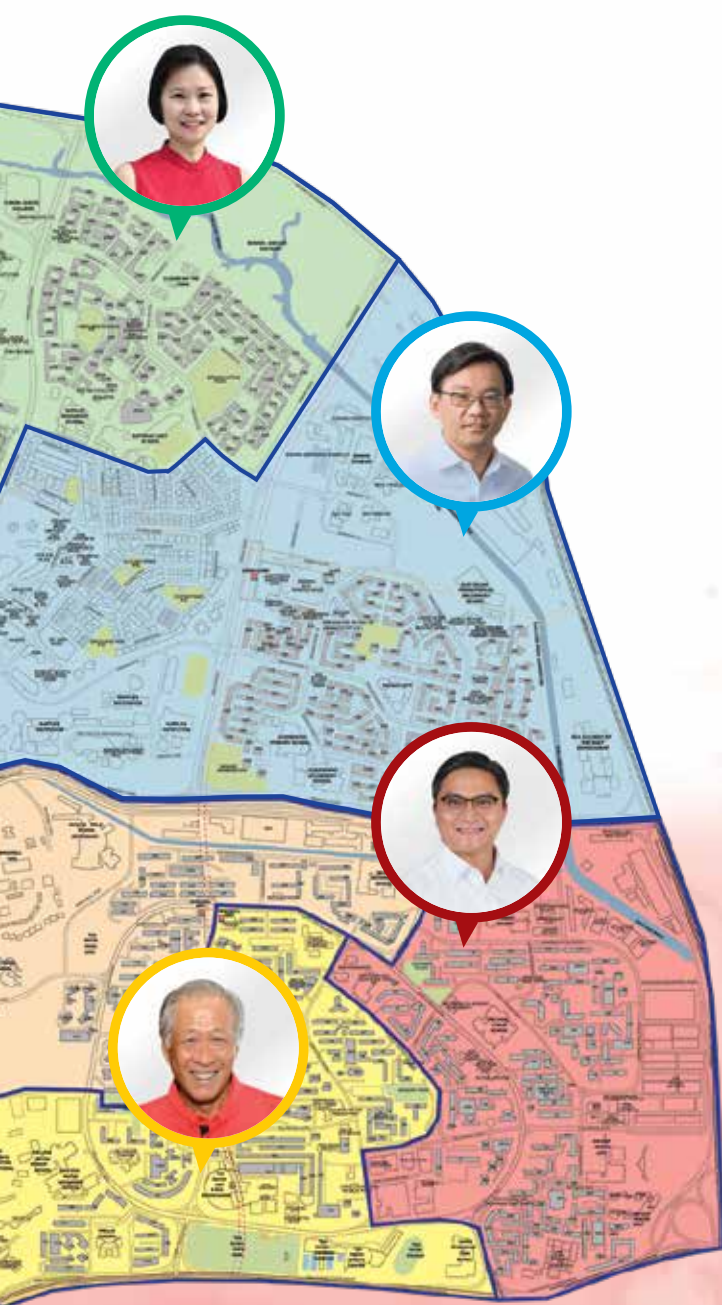

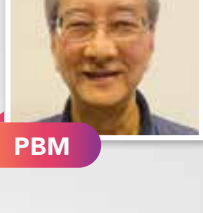

GETTING TO KNOW



President Scholar 2020
Ms Alyssa Marie Loo Li Ann
Resident of Bishan East-Sin Ming

Ms Alyssa Marie Loo Li Ann, 19, is the first President's Scholar to pursue linguistics at university, and she aspires to create a chatbot that can recognise Singlish to aid with government schemes. With the extensive government support and schemes available, she hopes to integrate and have an artificial intelligence system where you can just type out your income level and what kind of help you need, and find out what policy suits you best.

As a child, her mother now 47, sent her for art classes in the neighbourhood where they lived in Kedah, Malaysia. Her family moved to Singapore in 2008 when she was seven and Ms Loo obtained her citizenship at the age of 11. She continued to pursue art — taking it up as a subject in Raffles Girls' Secondary School and subsequently pursuing filmmaking in Raffles Institution.

The Raffles Institution alumna has since merged her passion for the arts with her volunteer work where she put together a photo essay of rental flat residents living in Stirling Road in a project with non-profit organisation Beyond Social Services last year.

Q Could you share with us how do you feel on being the only recipient for this year's President Scholarship Award?

A It was definitely surprising, not just at being the only recipient but to be a President's Scholar, I feel grateful to be given such trust and honoured to be recognised, and I will continue working hard to live up to the title.

Q What inspires you to go into public service ?

A I really value a sense of purpose and principle in my work, and I think there is no better place where our efforts can and will do good for the people in Singapore. I'm drawn by that common purpose to a goal bigger than just myself.

Q What are some of the changes you will like to see in the future?

A I hope to see more compassion; as the world gets more unpredictable (we have already seen from this year) I believe Singaporeans need to pull together and look out for one another. I also hope to see more diversity and vibrancy encouraged in our artistic and cultural scene, to move beyond tolerance of differences to harmonising and creating something uniquely Singaporean out of it.

Q Who inspires you the most and why?

A My parents, they are both very selfless and principled people and that's really been instilled in me. They taught me that it's about pursuing what I believe in and doing right by my values, and they embody that every day. When I feel lost about what I should do, I think about that.

Q How did joining your mum at her community work when you were young influence you and what changes you like to see to improve the community?

A She showed me the power of the Arts in bringing people together, whether it was through her upcycling craft projects, her canvas art jamming, or her clay art, she showed me that Art can be a platform for people to create something they are proud of together. My appreciation for Art as a community tool started from there.

Q Any advices for fellow striving students and aspiring scholars?

A Be a do-er. You don't need to worry about 'optimising' your CV or cherry-picking your involvements, let yourself pursue what you are interested in. But no matter what you choose to do, you must commit and give it your best.

Q When did you start batik painting and how did you get started?

A I started batik painting back in 1970s in my 30s. I was inspired by an Italian artist after attending his exhibition featuring batik techniques. I thought to myself, batik is an art originating from my region and heeded to the calling. Thus, I headed to Malaysia and Indonesia, where large part of community was involved in the art of batik painting and started my self-learning journey.

Q Which is your proudest/favourite design and is there a story behind?

A I do not have a favourite as I believe every piece of artwork is created with heart and has its own unique character. Every masterpiece I have created in the past decades was done with excitement, passion and feelings.

Q How has batik painting changed your life?

A Batik painting has certainly changed my life, giving me an avenue of expressing my interpretations and my inner feelings. For example, when I see flowers, I would interpret and translate their beauty to my paintings, which can be hung in every home, bringing everlasting warmth.

Q What are some of the memorable experiences contributing to local community and art scene?

A I had the privilege of conducting many workshops in America and Asia, but the most memorable experience was one conducted at NUS last year. It was extremely heart-warming to engage many local students with interest and potential batik art and be tributed for my efforts and passion.

Q How do you feel about winning the Cultural Medallion award?

A I am delighted and honoured to have received this award, but it also means new responsibility. There is no full stop in art and at my age, I hope to continue contributing new works to the local batik painting scene and guide the younger generation of artists to evolve and excel.

Q What is your valuable advice for aspiring young artists?

A Batik art is not just about learning the technique. We have to constantly improve, create, experiment and achieve breakthroughs. In my lifetime, I am very grateful to have the opportunities to promote this special artform both locally and internationally, bringing batik painting to greater heights.
